

Consequences

When everyone follows the rules, we have fun, productive rehearsals, and produce a better play! When people violate the rules, we have problems. Students were warned of the following consequences for breaking the rules:

- Step 1: Warning.
- Step 2: Time Out during Drama Club.
- Step 3: Note or phone call home.

(Severe infractions proceed directly to Step 3.)

Please note that any student who reaches Step 3 on more than one occasion will be asked not to return to Drama Club for the remainder of the semester, and no refund will be issued.

Line-Learning

This week in Drama Club, your student received a script for our play, “Goldie Lockes and the Nine Bears.” It’s important for your child to bring her script to Drama Club *every week*. I strongly encourage your child to begin working on lines *right away!* As the old saying goes, “By the yard it’s hard, but inch by inch, it’s a cinch.” Even if your student receives a large part, spending about ten minutes each school day with the script *now* will get him or her performance-ready in no time—without any last-minute cramming! **If your young actor needs tips on learning lines, please visit www.dramabygeorge.com/lines for ideas.**
